Mobile Harbour Crane is suitable for the efficient handling of bulk cargoes, as well as the safe transportation of general cargoes. The LHM 420 Mobile Harbour Crane raises and lowers loads at up to 120m per minute and has a maximum load capacity of 124 MT. It can handle up to 38 containers per hour with its

hybrid drive. Please note that this does not mean that PT will be handling 38 containers per hour for the duration of the Shipping Season but rather the new crane provides PT with flexibility in the types of services delivered at the port. In purchasing the LHM 420, the long term vision of the Picton Terminals as a global market leader, is being realized. More site upgrades and state of the art directions are on schedule and will be announced later this year. Additional work continues on our site-wide berm to ensure it. conforms to our engineered stormwater management plan and that it is ready for planting 2000 native species in spring.



The PT Team is testing FUSION™ Release beet juice anti-icing to prevent ice buildup on our patio stones and wooden porches.

FUSION™ Release beet juice is non-staining, pet and garden-friendly, and used by the St Lawrence Seaway and the Port of Montreal (to prevent locks and marine equipment from freezing). This is not an ice melter but a product to apply before freezing rain to prevent the ice from adhering tightly to the road surface.

Picton Terminals is again giving away 1 gal spray bottles of FUSIONTM
Release beet juice so you can test the product on your properties and farms etc. We are also pleased that PEC Fire & Rescue will be testing FUSIONTM

Road Salt Trucked out Nov 2018-Feb 2019

PT's certified Drone Pilot flies a full site scan monthly, which helps us to manage logistics, on site traffic and Dry Storage construction progress for our site.

Below, please note the 3 (black) tarped stockpiles of road salt in mid Nov. 2018 and the same view showing one remnant pile in Feb.

We estimate >80k MT has been trucked off site since November.

Picton Terminals supplies road salt to municipalities and private contractors across eastern Ontario.
