

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#### **Emergency Management Plans**

Picton Terminals is adding a custom designed Foam Filled Oil Boom to our dock for Emergency Use. The self-contained boom is easy to use and store. The boom will sit permanently on our dock at the ready. The boom is not a requirement by any government agencies but PT will continue to be an environmental leader with the hopes others will follow.
