- Working with Coverall Tarping to customize and install tarps over the 2017/18 Windsor Salt stockpiles.
- Integrate tugboat Sheri Lynn S into upcoming PT projects.

In 2017, Picton Terminals built a new stormwater management system, addressing the salt water runoff which has occurred on site for over 3 decades. Additional containment ponds were built and a berm was added along our eastern boundary. Collectively, these changes prevent salty water runoff into Picton Bay and adjoining properties.
